
ACADEMIC REP **OB DESCRIPTION**

WHAT IS A REP?



HOW DO I GET INVOLVED?

Reps are appointed in departments at the beginning of the academic year and usually students will be given a chance to choose who represents them. You may be asked to write a short paragraph or make a short video about who you are and why you want to be a Rep. Your department can let you know the process they use to appoint reps.

IS THERE TRAINING AND SUPPORT?

Yes! When you've been appointed you will have to register officiall with the Students' Union and complete online rep training, which will explain the role in more detail and give you tips for success.

The Students' Union manages the rep system and provides advice, support and additional opportunities to reps all year round. They also help senior reps to organise your forums. The rep forums help you to share ideas and best practice, develop possible solutions, ignite campaigns, and hear from other reps in similar situations.

ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

Throughout the year, Reps will be offered opportunities to develop skills. This may include taking part in focus groups, acting as a student consultant on new developments, becoming a student panel member in important university processes, running to be a senior rep or student leader, and taking part in additional skills development training.

THE DETAILS...

Time commitment: about 6 hours per term, a bit more if you want to go above and beyond!

Fixed events: staff-student committees (SSCs) in your department, twice-termly student-led faculty forums, and training

Flexible: the time you spend gathering feedback from your students and the format in which you do it - think outside the box.

Qualifications required: None! As long as you're a Lancaster University student, you're eligible.
