Oliver Robinson

Reshaping our Union is a mammoth task, and I'm not quite done yet, and I therefore humbly ask you to **re-elect me for a second term** so I can see this tough transition through to the end.

Hello there! I'm Oliver Robinson, Philosophy Student from Cartmel College, and I've had the privilege of being your SU President and Chair of the Trustee Board for the last 8 months. Despite it being an incredibly tough year, with the FTOs working together, we've achieved a lot.

When I was elected nearly 9 months ago, I promised I would <u>create a Union Council, implement an Elected Trustee Board</u>, declare a Climate Emergency and include student consultation on our new CEO. Students had input into the recruitment process, <u>a Climate Emergency has now been declared</u>, and <u>there is a referendum on our Constitution</u> running alongside this election.

Alongside my manifesto, <u>I fought with the Rent Strikers</u>, <u>helped secure £3million for students</u> and got rent rebates and <u>freezes from LUSU Living</u>. With the VP Welfare I also fought to secure an out of hours mental health service in the University, and <u>protected Union finances for your future</u>.

A Union That Works For You

With COVID hammering the Union, and revealing many of its weaknesses, we need to ensure that our finances and independence are secured. This means that I will fight to restore the full block grant and allow the Sugarhouse and other student-facing services to operate more effectively through new expertise on Board. I will focus on high impact areas of service - the SU Advice service, and supporting all student groups.

I will:

- Secure the Union's financial future to prioritise delivering what matters to you
- Finalise the Union's independence so we can criticise the University freely
- Lead on the implementation of the governance changes you've been calling for

Including and Empowering every Student

You are the lifeblood of your Union, and without your passion and dedication, there is no Students' Union at all. The SU is too often seen as an obstacle in the way of student groups, but should be seen as something that genuinely supports the creation of spaces for people to explore ideas and activities together.

I will:

- Safely re-open The Sugarhouse at first opportunity
- Support the creation of a new campaigns system
- Support the creation of new societies and de-bureaucratisation of the re-affiliation process
- Support the Liberation Officers to lead on liberation issues and create a new Board-level sub-committee to ensure accountability for these issues
- Support the re-introduction of college and recreational sport

Supporting students after COVID

Even with light at the end of the tunnel, the transition out of COVID won't be flawless, and we will need to be able to provide opportunities for students who can't make it to the UK as easily, or are otherwise vulnerable.

I will:

- Campaign nationally to fight for tuition fee refunds for those studying during lockdown
- Lobby for virtual learning to continue for those students who can't get to Lancaster
- Keep pushing for the expansion of Uni mental health services
- Ensure that Postgrads aren't forgotten by the University, and support the Doctoral Academy
- Prioritise recruitment for new student staff, offering part time employment during your studies to help you get by
- Support the creation of even better college communities with our JCRs and reverse the centralisation of services that have occurred in recent years

Next year will be better, but COVID has already weakened the SU. As an experienced leader, I am in a far better position to ensure that the SU, and by extension Lancaster University, is a better community for all. I haven't achieved everything I set out to do due to the difficult circumstances, and all those things that I am yet to do from my last manifesto still stand going forward.

The groundwork has been set in the last 8 months, and I am certain that I am in a position to leverage the key relationships I've established, for the benefit of you. It's time to be critical of the University's failings, both behind closed doors and outside of them.
