Hey, I'm Dom, a masters student, current member of the National Union of Students (NUS) National Scrutiny Council (NSC), former Grizedale President, former SU VP and previous NUS delegate.

Let's get straight into it. I'm running as NUS delegate because:

NUS has a problem with racism and transphobia within the movement. Over recent years its proposed defunding of the trans campaign - which I campaigned against at the time. Equally, trans students have come under attack multiple times, locally and nationally, and the NUS has been far too silent during these times. We need people within NUS who will continue to push for the NUS trans campaign and keep trans rights a focus at the top level of NUS.

Another issue is racism. NUS has a problem with antisemitism. Over the last year, we saw a president elected who was called out for antisemitism by the Jewish community and dismissed after an independent investigation took place. This is disgusting and unacceptable. Antisemitism has no place within NUS, just like any form of racism does not have a place.

Currently, there is another investigation into the wider culture of antisemitism of NUS taking place and we are awaiting that result. As a Jewish student who has been involved in NUS for several years, it makes me disgusted at the racism that has been allowed to flourish. We NEED delegates who will stand up against this very vocally and as someone with years of experience and being a current NUS NSC member, I'll continue to stamp out all forms of racism in our movement.

It's simple, Jewish students, like myself and my friends, did not feel comfortable at the conference last year and this needs to change.

Over the years we've seen more and more disengagement with NUS from students, especially Lancaster students. The reason? NUS is out of touch and doesn't focus on the issues that students want and need them to focus on. As NUS delegate and NSC member, I constantly ask the questions on how they know students want this, or what engagement they've had to prove this should be the focus. Currently, on NSC we have been working with the NUS officers on a campaign plan around the cost-of-living crisis. This is an issue that all students care about, and as delegate/NSC member I'll continue to make sure NUS is focussing on the issues that matter to Lancaster.

The student movement is revolutionary, constantly leading the fight on progressive ideals in the sphere of politics. Now is the time for us as a movement to come together and stand up. The Conservative government is doing nothing to provide any sort of stability to students and make no mistake they are going after the student movement. We need delegates and leaders in NUS that are vocal, will submit motions, scrutinise the NUS officers and make sure the NUS is working to support our students, and students' union to deliver supportive work locally.
